STORYCORPS DIY is designed to help ordinary people record interviews in an effort to preserve legacy stories for future generations. After a recording is uploaded to their website, they are stored in the Library of Congress for preservation.


Learn how to document and preserve the local stories and history of your community. After years of working closely with community partners, StoryCorps has created a new set of do-it-yourself resources to help organizations develop their own interview collection projects.

With multimedia resources and guides, StoryCorps DIY offers insights and instructions on how to:

- **Promote listening:** Preserve the life stories of your community members, and facilitate meaningful interactions between community members.
- **Build an archive:** Develop your organization's oral history collection, and add voices and perspectives that are currently missing.
- Create dynamic public programming: Bring new audiences to your organization by inviting them to record their own stories, or to take part in listening events.
- Partner in new ways with peer organizations: Forge meaningful connections with partner organizations for a shared project goal.

StoryCorps DIY is best suited for groups and organizations that wish to create a sustainable community program around storytelling. It is FREE to download the app and to sign-up!
